- Admissibility to the university. Undergraduate Admissions Services determines eligibility for admission to UVic.
- 2. An acceptable undergraduate Bachelor's degree recognized by Undergraduate Admissions Services.
- 3. 3 units of approved English literature (or English literature and academic composition).
- 4. Demonstrated competency in written English (grade requirement; see page two).
- 5. See the three grade point average (GPA) requirements described on page two.
- 6. Approved academic studies in one or two teachable subjects relevant to the BC curriculum. A list of available subjects is provided on the website below.
- Applicants must satisfy the experience requirement described on the program website below. Eligible applicants may also be invited to attend an interview.
- 8. For current <u>applicant selection criteria</u>, please see the program website below. This is subject to change for future intakes; please see the program website updated annually each fall for the upcoming intake.

- At UVic, 'upper-level' refers to 300 and/or 400-level courses normally taken in third and fourth year after introductory studies.
