

Upon first hearing the title of the exhibition for the 2011 BFA Graduation exhibition, I must admit I perceived it as being tongue in cheek, possibly even dismissive of the potential of the works and the diverse students it represents. This type of exhibition has become an annual event at UVic and in art programs across the country. It has become an exercise, a right of passage, a marker, an academic and personal milestone, and it has been looming in the minds of these students since they began their degree. It is not to be taken lightly. Does it not then deserve a more fitting title? In an event of such accountability, why would the students consider it in quip?

#### Why Indeed!

Perhaps my skepticism has misread this 'exclamation of triumph or pride' as dismissive rather than poised? We are all familiar with how easy it is to reject efforts through hurried appraisal. Following this thought, TA-DA becomes, much like the common but unspecified ground these students share, more than just an exhibition (title), but rather an announcement of arrival. TA-DA is a declaration of presence, an invitation, and perhaps a barb to see these works and artists not simply as annual exercise or right of passage but rather, as a context for what is and what might be. For while there have been, and will continue to be BFA exhibitions for years to come, the exhibition TA-DA, occurs for the first and only time, in a place which will never be the same again. Thus, TA-DA announces the arrival of original works, not in the sense of modernist ideals, but rather as new and authentic representations of what is here, now. It is up to us to consider the results of these varied explorations, outside the comforts of skepticism, with recognition of the individual accomplishments before us and the implications of what might soon come to be.




## **Poppy Clavette**














Space Majjick Stop Animation (1:10 min) - Variable Dimensions, Metalic Objects






