In this program you will learn about how data is represented, exchanged, standardized, and applied to improve our healthcare systems. You will learn also about the details, challenges, implementations, and acceptance of modern data-driven health information exchange. In this session, the program is described from a pragmatic and professional point of view. The Program is a one-year, part-time program with weekly online evening classes and a virtual workshop. It is intended to meet national and international needs for best practices in controlled terminologies, classification, and interoperability standards used in healthcare. Graduates of the Program are eligible to receive a Certified Terminology Standards Specialist (CTSS) professional designation for which there is a significant demand within specialized healthcare information management roles.

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
