Why ICDG programs?

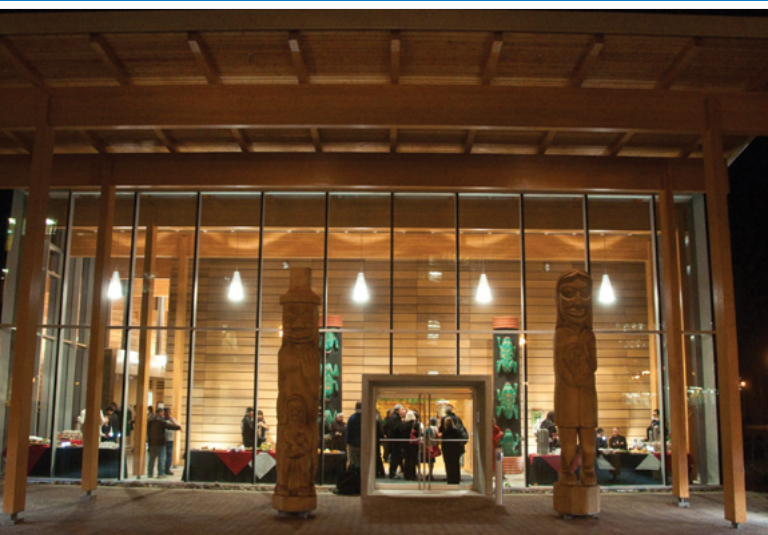
Authentic. Designed by Indigenous people for Indigenous people.
