Website release: version 7.0 of **The Map of Early Modern London** (MoEML), directed by **Janelle Jenstad** (English), was released on May 4, 2022

Summary: This version features a finding aid for 135 early maps of London, 575 new historical people, 338 new bibliography entries, 305 new toponymic variants, 9 new locations, 35 new encyclopedia articles, 82 short encyclopedia stubs, and digital facsimiles of images from the British Library and the Chapin Library.
