Course Description:

Queer and trans writers and artists have long been responsible for shifting the cultural landscapes of life writing and documentary. In this practice-based course, we will examine how writers and non-fiction artists validate, deepen, and disrupt well established histories, genres and genealogies of knowledge about gender and sexuality both in the academy and in the arts.

Objectives:

This course is designed to encourage students to think outside the bounds of common academic practice, toward more creative and community-based projects and potentials. Students will be expected to engage a variety of texts with visiting guest artists and to imagine spaces of learning which far exceed the campus or classroom.

Key Readings for course:

Texts include (but are not limited to) Alison Bechdel's Fun Home, Janet Mock's Redefining Realness, Maggie Nelson's The Argonauts, Julietta Singh's No Archive Will Restore You, Vivek Shraya's I'm Afraid of Men, Leah Lakshmi Piepzna-Samarasinha's Care Work, Allyson Mitchell and Dierdre Logue's Feminist Art Gallery, Chris Vargas' Museum of Transgender Hirstory and Art, films by Thirza Cuthand, and the Transgender Archives at UVic.

Evaluation:

Process-based assignments – all of which differently prioritize active engagement, participation and collaborative presentation – lead students to the creation of their own creative work and/or archival project.
