Greek 101 is an introduction to Attic Greek, the dialect of Classical Athens. The course introduces the basic grammar and vocabulary necessary to read ancient Greek, and features readings adapted from a variety of ancient Greek authors.

- a basic Greek vocabulary of about 150 words
- basic Greek grammar
- basic Greek reading skills
- historical and cultural contexts of ancient Greek
