

Greek and Roman Studies 331: Greek History from the Bronze Age to Alexander Fall 2024 TWF 1:30-2:20 p.m. Professor Geoffrey Kron



GRS 331 surveys Greek history from the emergence of Minoan-Mycenaean civilization until the death of Alexander the Great. The course focuses on the relationship of the Greeks to other Mediterranean and Near Eastern civilizations, the nature of the Greek polis, Greek colonization, the rise of democracy, and competing bids for supremacy on the part of Athens, Sparta, Thebes, and Macedon.

- explore current scholarly debates about Greek history
- situate Greek-speaking peoples within the wider Mediterranean region
