# Greek and Roman Studies 358: The Ancient City of Athens

Athens has been inhabited continuously from the Neolithic period until the present day. The city is therefore an excellent case study in urban transformation over time. GRS 358 explores the art and architecture of ancient Athens, the structure and operation of its government, and the lives of its inhabitants. The course pays special attention to recent discoveries and the ongoing excavations in the Athenian Agora.

- explore the institutions of Athenian democracy
- explore the social history of ancient Athens
