OBJECTIVES AND COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course examines the legal rules, policies and principles that govern the eligibility of citizens, permanent residents and foreign nationals to enter, remain in, work in and study in Canada. It examines the processes whereby foreign nationals may become permanent residents, whereby permanent residents may become citizens, whereby foreign nationals may become temporary residents, and whereby a foreign national loses status. It also examines the legal and constitutional framework supervising the immigration and citizenship regime.

METHODOLOGY

Class time will be divided between lectures, class discussions, exercises and activities designed to achieve the course objectives. Readings will introduce and explore related issues and set the tone for discussions within the group.
