### **OBJECTIVES AND COURSE DESCRIPTION**

This course provides an overview of the philosophy, history, and real-world practice of criminal justice in the United States. Students will learn about constitutional rights, the progression of criminal cases, the confluence of criminal justice and race, gender, and poverty, and how the U.S. criminal justice system impacts victims, defendants, families, communities, and lawyers. Students will learn about the relationship between courts and the purpose and use of laws which govern due process. The course will review the history of the U.S. war on drugs and explore the racial-economic political project underpinning U.S. mass incarceration. The course will also discuss the power and central role of elected officials, and especially elected local prosecutors, in creating and perpetuating the U.S. carceral state.

### **METHODOLOGY**

This course will be taught in a mixed format of lecture and discussion. Class participation and robust discussion will be essential for students wanting to maximize their learning. In-person attendance is mandatory.

### **EXPECTED EVALUATION METHODOLOGY**

1. Attendance and discussion – 20%
2. Presentation – 20%
3. Research, Writing and Analysis demonstrated in several reflection papers – 60%

Students may not write their Major Research Paper in this course
