### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

This course examines the ethical and professional dimensions of the practice of law, including the meaning and practical application of lawyers' ethical obligations and professional responsibility. The course offers an opportunity to develop, challenge and apply student's views of what it means to be a lawyer, and acquire the knowledge and skills needed to identify and address ethical dilemmas that arise in the legal profession. Topics covered include admission to and regulation of the practice of law, the role and responsibilities of members of the legal profession in society, the nature and scope of lawyers' duties, the lawyer-client relationship, critical contemporary issues impacting the legal profession, ethical practice in multi-juridical Canada, and ethics in selected practice areas. The course is designed to satisfy the graduation requirements for call to the profession set by the Federation of Law Societies of Canada.

### **TEACHING METHODOLOGY**

Classes include lectures, discussions, exercises, presentations and other activities designed to achieve the course objectives. Readings introduce and explore related issues, and provide a basis for discussion. Visiting instructors from the practicing bar will contribute their expertise.

### **EVALUATION METHODOLOGY**

Students are marked on a pass / fail basis.

Students must pass each of the evaluative segments to pass the course, including written assignments and small group presentations.

Attendance is mandatory (with approved exceptions, to be specified at the beginning of the course).

Students are expected to participate in group exercises and class discussions, and contribute to an inclusive and respectful classroom environment.

There is no mid-term or final examination.
