"For me, the university was the mind, L'Arche was the heart, but the trapeze was about the body. And the body tells a spiritual story," said well-known professor, priest and writer Henri Nouwen. From the 1867 hit song "The Daring Young Man on the Flying Trapeze" with its gender-fluidity and the narrator's economic outrage, to more recent poets, theologians and practitioners, the trapeze has been seen as risky, counter-cultural, sexy — and spiritual.
