General Information

The **Europe Sustainability Field School** provides unique experiential education opportunities for UVic students. This **travel-study program** focuses on the cutting-edge **sustainability** efforts of cities in Northern Europe.

The **benefits** of getting out of the classroom to learn in the field include: personal growth, expanded worldview, and enhanced career opportunities. In 2025 we are offering an exciting **4-week itinerary** that includes cities in **Norway, Sweden, Denmark** and **Germany**. En route, students will meet with urban planners, community leaders, scholars, and other engaged individuals who are grappling with the challenges of building socially and ecologically sustainable and resilient cities. Students travel by train, bus, ferry, bike, and local transit to various sites of interest. Hostel or equivalent affordable accommodation is arranged. Most days involve guided field trips, hands-on workshops, and engaging discussions while ensuring time available for individual exploration.

Eligibility

To be eligible for the program you must be a UVic student that has completed their first year of study and be able to register in 300-level Geography courses, or be granted special permission from the field school instructor: Cam Owens (camo@uvic.ca). Non-Geography students are invited to apply. Priority will be given to students with interest in the subject matter – urban sustainability.

Geography 388 – Regional Studies: Europe

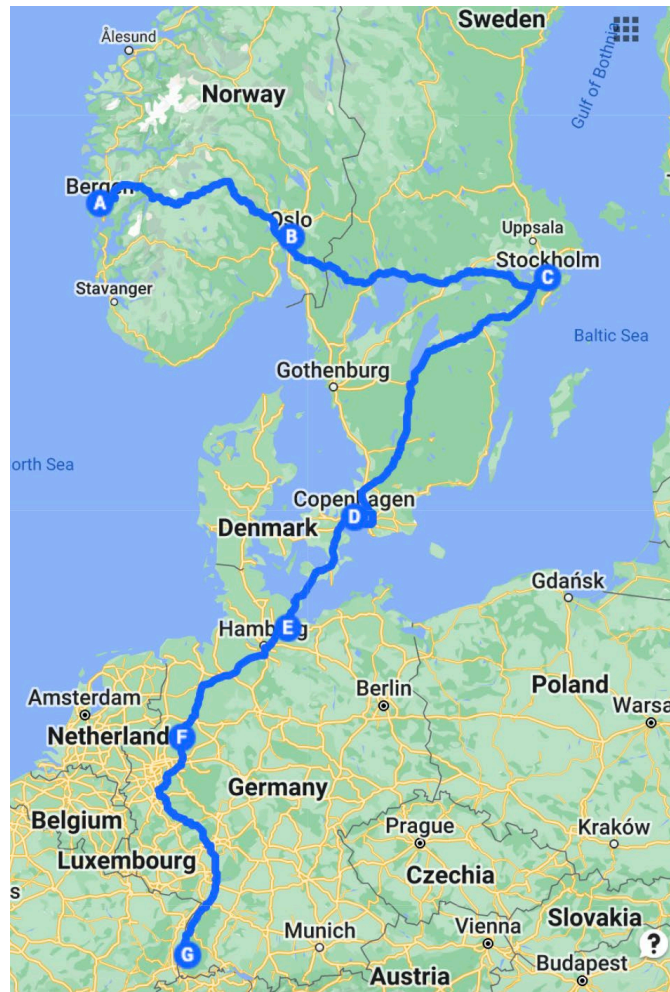

Fees and Financial Support

Fees:

Students pay **regular UVic tuition** and a **field school program fee**.

The field school program fee can be paid by **cheque, money order, counter cheque, or cash ONLY**. Cheques should be made payable to the University of Victoria. Payment can be dropped off at the Geography main office (David Turpin Building room B203), or mailed (cheque only). **DO NOT MAIL CASH**.

The field school program fee is \$4250

- **\$1000 deposit** paid at time of application (**due Thurs, Nov 28th, 2024**)
- **\$3250** paid by **Thurs, Feb 27th, 2025**

It includes:

- All accommodations during the travel study part of the field program
- Breakfasts
- Activity costs (entry admissions, guided tour and workshop fees, presenters' fees)
- Ground transportation (e.g. train, local transit, ferry, bike rentals)
- Emergency contingency fund

It does not include:

- Tuition (paid separately to the registrar)
- Airfare (to allow students flexibility in terms of travel plans)
- Other expenses: e.g. meals (apart from breakfast), Noentertainment, travel insurance (if you need coverage beyond your UVSS plan)

Please note the following **refund policy**. After February 27th, if a student is no longer able to participate in the program, we cannot guarantee a refund. If a replacement cannot be found, we will retain the \$1,000 deposit and potentially additional amounts. This is because we are required to pay for certain expenses, such as accommodation and transportation, in advance, and these payments may not be refundable by the vendors.
