Human Dimensions of Climate Change seeks two Sessional Lecturers to Team Teach

HDCC 300: Climate Change for Social Transformation 1.5 units

Appointment within CUPE 4163 (Component 3) Sessional Lecturers

Applications are being sought for two Sessional Lecturer positions for the **Spring Term of 2023** to <u>team teach</u> HDCC 300: Climate Change for Social Transformation, **1.5 units.** The instructors are responsible for one half of the course and are remunerated at 0.50 of the sessional rate. Please submit a brief letter of application, Curriculum Vitae, and the names of two references by email to <u>idpassis@uvic.ca</u>, no later than 4:00 pm Tuesday, April 19, 2022. After the hire is finalized, the instructors will work together to finalize the course syllabus to be approved by the Associate Dean Academic, Social Sciences. This position will require ongoing coordination and consultation among the teaching team.

This course offers an opportunity for critical engagement with climate change as physical transformation, cultural object, and incitement to social transformation. This interdisciplinary course approaches climate change as complex phenomena that are co-constituted by social and natural worlds. The course will introduce students to a variety of lenses, knowledge networks, culturally constructed narratives and social justice issues that will help them understand why responding to climate change is challenging but also opens up opportunities for change.

This course is offered once a week, Wednesdays 2:30 – 5:20. The positions report to the Associate Dean Academic, Social Sciences, and are within CUPE 4163 Component 3. For more information on the program and its courses and electives, please visit: http://www.web.uvic.ca/hdcc/.

In all appointments, preference will be given to those with a completed or nearly complete PhD in a relevant field and a combination of expertise and experience appropriate to the courses concerned.
