

# SOCI 374 – Qualitative Research Methods

## **Course Description:**

This course is designed to introduce students to contemporary qualitative research methods in sociology, and to help students foster best practices in research design.

## **Course Outcomes/Objectives:**

1. To understand mainstream qualitative research methods as practiced in sociology
2. To understand how Indigenous research practices both challenge and enrich mainstream research practices
3. To become comfortable with Human Research Ethics Board applications, survey and interview script construction online and digital discourse analyses, and best practices in qualitative research

## **Course Pre/Co-requisites:**

Students are required to take SOCI 211 either prior to taking SOCI 374, or at the same time.

## **Topics May Include:**

Critical discourse analysis, digital archival analysis, interview scripts and interviewing, critical research methods.
