My life is very much bound up with this campus and its institutions and I have always acknowledged that comes with rights and responsibilities for service. I have been a member of this university since 1985. I have received 3 degrees from this institution (BA 1988, MA 1992, PhD 2004) and have guided thousands of students on their way to theirs. While my appointment to faculty is recent (Associate Teaching Professor, July 1, 2022), I have been teaching here for over 25 years (Sessional 1998-2007, Continuing Sessional 2007-2022). I have also worked as staff in multiple units across campus (primarily library-based). For all of that I received my year-35 pin for service in October 2022.

The so-called "post-pandemic" world we find ourselves in is not a 'return to normal' but one on the cusp of great change. The challenge will be in how the university adapts to and influences this new world. While I have always made development an active part of my process -- doing workshops since 2003 with what is now LTSI (Learning and Teaching Support and Innovation) and undertaking coursework at the Digital Humanities Summer Institute since 2013) -- I have also found great satisfaction and interest in university governance. Since my appointment to faculty, which has allowed me greater scope for my activities, I've served on four search committees and am an active member of seven policy committees; I am Chair of the AHVS Equity Committee where I have spearheaded policies such as the alignment of our TOR with UVic's EAP and the creation of a department Statement on Equity and Diversity. I currently serve on the Senate Committee for Academic Standards as the President's nominee.

Eligibility

Persons eligible to stand for election, to make nominations and to vote shall be regular faculty members. The Senate, using the definition in the *University Act*, has specified that "faculty member" is a person who is classified in University records as "faculty" and designated as "regular, at the rank of lecturer, assistant teaching professor, teaching professor, assistant professor, associate professor or professor, or in an equivalent position designated by the Senate". (This excludes employees classified as "visiting", "adjunct", or "sessional.")

The Senate has further determined that a faculty member on leave of absence or study leave from the University of Victoria continues to be eligible to vote and to hold office on the Senate and the Board of Governors subject to the rules of those bodies.

Withdrawal

Withdrawal by a person duly nominated as a candidate for election shall be made in writing to the University Secretary (see <u>Rules to Govern Elections to the Board of Governors and the Senate, section 8.1</u>).

Term of Office

The term of office for this position on Senate will begin on July 1, 2024 and will end on June 30, 2027.
