Rationale for proposed change:

To strengthen the academic quality of the program, provide better guidance to students interested in applying to the Minor, and ease its administration.

Title change: Clarifies but does not change: this minor has always been interdisciplinary, as indicated by the first sentence of the previous entry.

Key requirements and their purpose:

- "be distinct from programs already offered at UVic" on occasion students have applied for a SDIM that is close in purpose to an existing UVic program or programs, apparently because they did not quite meet the requirements of the existing program; the SDIM should be only for situations in which UVic does not offer a relevant credential
- "be designed and completed under the supervision of a faculty member" this is meant to ensure the student has appropriate guidance in developing the theme and required courses for the minor, in part to enhance the minor's intellectual coherence requiring a faculty member's oversight addresses the concern about creating an academic credential outside the regular approval process in a fashion similar to requiring a faculty member's sponsorship of a directed reading course on a subject not approved through the curriculum approval process
- "consist of 13.5 units, with a minimum of 7.5 units of courses numbered 300 and above" the current Calendar entry does not specify the required number of units this number of units situates the SDIM between a General and a minor that cannot be counted towards a General degree it signifies that the SDIM requires significant specialization in a subject
- "be approved before more than 6.0 units of coursework counting towards the minor has been completed" and "be declared prior to the student achieving fourth-year standing (42.0 units)" these two requirements are intended to ensure a SDIM reflects a coherent program of study, rather than an effort to compile a credential from courses already taken
- "be approved by the Director of the Office of Interdisciplinary Academic Programs" currently a SDIM requires approval of "the Chair/Adviser of the departments concerned" most Chairs and department advisors are unfamiliar with the purpose and requirements of the SDIM, and are not well positioned to assess the overall coherence of a proposed minor or its interaction with existing minor programs already offered at UVic in practice, the Associate Dean Advising (see below) has consulted informally with the Director of the OIAP in recent years
- "be approved by the Associate Dean of Academic Advising of Humanities, Science and Social Sciences" this existing requirement will continue; between them, the interdisciplinary Director and the Associate Dean Advising can effectively assess the overall coherence of a proposed minor or its interaction with existing minor programs already offered at UVic, and will consult with individual chairs and directors as needed
