

DRAFT MINUTES

A meeting of the Senate of the University of Victoria was held on March 2, 2012 at 3:30 p.m. in the Senate and Board Chambers, University Centre, Room A180.

1. APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

Dr. Turpin advised members of the Senate that item 6 (a)(i) on the agenda had been withdrawn by Dr. Wilson, Chair, Senate Committee on Academic Standards.

3. BUSINESS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES

a. Percentage Grading Scale

Dr. Eastman reminded members of Senate that, at the last meeting, Ms. Charlton had pointed out a mistake in the copy of the Faculty of Law grading scale provided to Senate in the docket for that meeting. Dr. Eastman said that the correct versions of all grading scales had been made available at this meeting.

b. Undergraduate Awards Terms of Reference

Ms. Lori Nolt advised members of Senate that the changes requested at the last meeting had been made and were reflected in the materials distributed in the docket.

4. REMARKS FROM THE CHAIR

a. President's Report

On the federal front, Dr. Turpin reported that budget day was now set for March 29, 2012.

With regard to provincial matters, Dr. Turpin reported that the provincial budget had provided for stable funding in 2012/2013 and planned decreases of 1% to 1.5% over the next two years. Dr. Turpin said that the presidents of post-secondary institutions had signed a letter to the Minister outlining their grave concerns over the implications of the reduction in budgets. Dr. Turpin said that internally, the executive had had numerous discussions on the implications of the provincial budget and Dr. Tremblay had been engaging with the deans of all the faculties. Dr. Tremblay said the idea was to plan for the future, but not to panic about it.

Dr. Turpin provided members of Senate with an update on the government letter of expectations. He said the university had received a draft letter from the government, asking for comments. He said the six universities belonging to the Research Universities Council of BC (RUCBC) had worked together to provide a response.

Regarding municipal matters, Dr. Turpin reported having met with mayors and councils in January and February, specifically Oak Bay and Saanich, Victoria and Esquimalt, and Central Saanich, North Saanich and Sidney. Meetings with mayors and councillors of all 13 municipalities were planned during 2012.

Dr. Turpin provided an update on matters at the university. He reported that:

- The strategic plan was complete and had been approved by the Board of Governors. Paper copies and a web version would be available shortly.
- An update on the privacy breach:
 - We should expect the release of two reports as a result of the ongoing reviews. The
 report of the investigation of the Office of the Information and Privacy
 Commissioner was expected to be made public in the next month or so.
 - o The external reviewer's report, which was broader in scope, was expected in April or May and was also intended to be made public on the web. Dr. Flaherty's work was well underway as was the internal assessor Professor Cassels' work.
- A series of open houses were scheduled for March 8, 10, and 14, 2012 for a broader consultation with the public on the parking structure for CARSA.
- An update on searches:
 - o Vice-President Research and Vice-President External Relations searches were both well underway
 - o Associate Vice-President International Dr. Tremblay said Dr. Andrew M. Marton had been ratified. She provided a brief overview of Dr. Marton's credentials.
- Alumni Week on February 6 11, 2012 had seen 17 successful events in seven days, drawing 2,286 attendees (up by 17% over 2010) and including four faculty reunions and the Distinguished Alumni Ceremony with an unprecedented 12 awards.
- There would be an announcement in April 2012 of a \$5M gift in support of the Faculty of Human and Social Development.

With regard to awards and prizes at the university, Dr. Turpin announced that:

• Dr. Elango Elangovan, professor and director of international programs with the Gustavson School of Business was among 10 Canadian scholars honoured with a 2012 3M National Teaching Fellowship. Dr. Elangovan was the 9th UVic scholar to receive this honour since its inception. (Dr. Devor, Dean of the Faculty of Graduate Studies and Professor of Sociology was amongst the nine having received the award in 2000).

- UVic climate science expert and Canada Research Chair, Dr. Andrew Weaver, and Dr. Mary-Ellen Purkis, Dean of UVic's Faculty of Human and Social Development, were this year's recipients of the UVic Community Leadership Awards. The award acknowledged outstanding leadership in linking UVic and the community for greater public benefit.
- On February 27, 2012, Dr. Alisdair Boraston, professor in the Department of Biochemistry and Microbiology, was awarded one of six prestigious 2012 E.W.R. Steacie Memorial Fellowships. Dr. Boraston's research had produced numerous insights into protein-carbohydrate-enyzme interactions, and had broad applications in such areas as production of biofuels and seeking solutions to antibiotic resistance.
- UVic biology professor and researcher Dr. Julia Baum was named among 126 U.S. and Canadian recipients of the 2012 Sloan Fellowships, announced by the Alfred P. Sloan Foundation in New York on February 15, 2012. The \$50,000 Fellowship would support Dr. Baum's research into the impact of fishing on the life of predatory species, such as sharks. (A total of only seven Canadian researchers received this honour in 2012).
- In January 2012, Dr. Budd Hall received notice of his appointment as the UNESCO Chair in Community-Based Research and Social Responsibility in Higher Education.
- Mr. Chip Wilson, founder and chair of the board of directors of yoga-wear giant Lululemon Athletica, had been named UVic's Gustavson School of Business Distinguished Entrepreneur of the Year.
- UVic had been named one of BC's Top Employers by Media Corp Canada (third year in a row), as well as one of Canada's Best Diversity Employers. In the latter connection, the university was recognized for a variety of initiatives, including:
 - o maintaining a diversity of equity steering committee,
 - o hosting an annual diversity research forum,
 - o managing a mental health task force, and
 - o launching the Positive Space Network to create a positive and inclusive environment for all staff and students.
- Recipients of the President's Distinguished Service Awards included:
 - Professor David Nelles (Earth & Ocean Sciences) Award for Excellence in Service
 - o Ms. Diana Walton (Nursing) Award for Excellence in Leadership
 - o Ms. Leah Stone (Enrolment Services) First Five Years Outstanding Contribution Award
 - Dr. Bonnie Leadbeater and the WITS team (Psychology) Team Award for Innovation
- Vikes men's basketball head coach Mr. Craig Beauchamp had been named Canada West coach of the year for the third time since taking over the head coaching job at UVic in 2003.
- Vikes senior guard Mr. Ryan MacKinnon of Comox, was also honoured as he was named a First Team Canada West all-star.

5. CORRESPONDENCE

a. Advisory Committee on Academic Accommodation and Access for Students with Disabilities

i. Annual report

Mr. Foster noted that the report included input the committee had provided to the Planning and Priorities Committee relating to the strategic plan. He said he had been disappointed that, although the word "accessibility" had been added in a few places, the suggestion about making UVic a destination of choice for people with disabilities and other input had not been reflected. Dr. Turpin said the Planning and Priorities Committee had discussed the input fully and had decided to keep the passages in question general (rather than include reference to a particular equity-seeking group).

In response to a question on social support, Mr. Dunsdon said this was important and it had been an issue raised at the committee. He said most of the activity in this area was undertaken by the Society for Students with a Disability (SSD).
