#### 4. REMARKS FROM THE CHAIR

# a. President's Report

Prof. Cassels provided a report to Senate. With respect to matters at the federal level, he summarized highlights from the federal budget. Prof. Cassels informed Senate of an upcoming federal initiative to develop a vision for innovation.

With respect to provincial matters, Prof. Cassels noted that a change was being implemented with respect to academic program proposals. Dr. Mateer provided information about the change to the process for submitting academic program proposals to the Ministry for approval. She reported on the new two-stage process and said the Senate Committee on Planning was considering how the changes would impact university processes. With respect to specific proposals, Dr. Mateer said the university had one program that was submitted under the old criteria but was not yet approved. It had not yet been determined how approval of this program would be impacted.

Prof. Cassels reported that the budget framework had been approved by the Board at its meeting earlier in the week.

Prof. Cassels provided an update on the process underway to review the university's policies regarding sexualized violence. He said the terms of reference were nearly final and the process, which would include research, consultation and recommendations regarding interim measures, would begin shortly. In response to a question, Prof. Cassels said more information about the process would be shared with members of Senate.

A question was raised about the federal budget and whether it was expected that preference for funding would be provided to universities that are members of the U15. Prof. Cassels said that, while he expected strong competition for funding, he did not expect membership in the U15 to be one of the criterion for funding.

A member reiterated support for the review of policies regarding sexualized violence and encouraged the university to implement interim measures to support survivors.

Dr. Castle provided Senate members with an overview of the university's application to the Canada First Research Excellence Fund. He reviewed the program's objectives and selection criteria. Dr. Castle summarized the university's proposal and discussed how it had been developed. He provided some information on expected timelines in the application process.

Dr. Mateer introduced the report.

### 7. PROPOSALS AND REPORTS FROM FACULTIES

- a. Faculty of Graduate Studies
  - i. Proposal to create a Faculty of Graduate Studies Council

Prof. Cassels reminded Senate members that this item had been brought to Senate previously for consultation and had received support. He said useful feedback had been provided by Senate and a revised proposal was now being presented for approval.

Dr. Capson introduced the proposal. He reviewed the process that had been undertaken to develop the proposal and provided a summary of the structure being proposed. He drew Senate's attention to the Constitution and Bylaws being presented for approval. With respect to the specifics of the proposal, Dr. Capson said he was most excited about increased graduate student representation.

A number of Senate members expressed support for the proposal. The increased graduate student representation was endorsed, as was the opportunity for increased communication between faculties.

A question was raised about the inclusion of emeritus faculty on the council. Dr. Capson clarified that voting membership was restricted to regular faculty members. He added that some involvement of emeritus faculty members could be considered. A question was raised about electronic and proxy voting. In response, Dr. Capson reviewed the pertinent section of the Bylaws.

Dr. Capson pointed out a discrepancy in the document presented to Senate. He noted that the chart outlining membership was not consistent with the membership rules in the Constitution. In response to a question, he confirmed that Senate was being asked to approve the Constitution and Bylaws.

# 8. PROPOSALS AND REPORTS FROM THE VICE-PRESIDENT ACADEMIC AND PROVOST

# a. Consultation on the International Plan Refresh

Dr. Mateer provided a presentation to Senate on the refresh of the International Plan. She began by summarizing progress on the 2006 International Plan. Dr. Mateer then provided an overview of the structure and process for the review, summarized the areas being considered in the review, discussed the consultation process and asked Senate members for their feedback.

Members of Senate made a number of comments, including

- noting the value of international experiences for students;
- asking about the supports in place for international co-ops;
- noting that support for faculty members in contributing to achievement of goals is required;
- observing that with some cohorts of international students silos are created, which are not beneficial for domestic or international students;
- stating that it can be difficult in some cases for international undergraduate students to work effectively in project teams and support is required for both students and faculty members in this regard;
- noting that is important to have systems in place to track students participating in international activities;
- asking for clarity in the plan about the university's vision regarding technology-enabled learning and engagement of international students; and
- noting the importance of ensuring that international students have sufficient English language ability to succeed at the university and that the appropriate supports are in place for both instructors, teaching assistants and students.
